General Definition of Work

Work is performed under the limited supervision of the Director of Teaching & Learning.

Essential Functions

Develops lesson plans and instructional materials according to effective teaching strategies and District philosophy and vision and implements instruction.

Completes evaluations on students; maintains appropriate files and records.

Communicates with parents in a timely manner; maintains positive and constructive communication with students, staff, parents and community.

Serves as an advocate for Students with English language needs by representing their needs to parents, and staff.

Provides indirect services through teacher consultation and evaluation review.

Recognizes learning problems and makes referrals as appropriate; encourages student enthusiasm for the learning process and development of good study habits and techniques.

Works cooperatively with parents and other staff members to reinforce the educational program for each student.

Attends and participates in various meetings, committees, conferences and workshops as required.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

Thorough knowledge of classroom teaching practices, methods and techniques; thorough knowledge of subject(s) taught; thorough knowledge of special education laws, principles, practices and procedures; thorough knowledge of the principles and methodology of effective teaching; thorough knowledge of district rules, regulations and procedures; thorough knowledge of effective instructional practice for English language learners including statutes for such learners; thorough skill in administering and interpreting assessments for English language learners; thorough skill completing due processes paperwork; general skill operating standard office equipment and applicable hardware and software; general skill using standard database and records programs; ability to compute rates, ratios and percentages; ability to remain current in core knowledge of curriculum areas; ability to communicate effectively orally and in writing; ability to establish and maintain standards of behavior; ability to deliver articulate oral presentations and written reports; ability to remain calm during stressful situations; ability to communicate effectively in unique ways with student populations; ability to work with diverse populations; ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with service providers, district staff, students, and parents or guardians.

Physical Requirements
